The Belladonna Racing entity is structured and equipped to race its Thoroughbreds anywhere in the world. So why did we decide to set up our home base in Kentucky? There are several good reasons; here are a few of the most important ones:

- History Horse racing has a rich history in the beautiful state of Kentucky. Historians believe that horse racing came to Lexington in 1787 and have traced racing in Louisville, home to Churchill Downs and host of the Kentucky Derby, back to 1783. The first Kentucky Derby was held in 1875. Lexington is home to Keeneland, the world's largest Thoroughbred auction house. In 2021, the four Keeneland sales (held in January, April, September and November) grossed \$621,880,600 while selling just over a combined 6,300 head.
- Race Tracks- Kentucky provides many options for a horse to compete at a variety of tracks. The two best known are Churchill Downs and Keeneland. Both of these tracks offer some of the strongest purses and premier stakes races in America. Kentucky also has Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky Downs in Franklin, and Ellis Park in Henderson. These five tracks offer horses of all different ability levels the chance to find a spot where they can be most competitive.
- Kentucky is also located in an area that makes it easy to ship horses to neighboring states with racetracks like Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, Virginia, and West Virginia. While New York, New Jersey and Maryland are a bit farther, it is still an easy van trip

- Top Equine Medical Facilities Kentucky is home to some of the most respected Equine Medical facilities and veterinarians in the world. Hagyard Equine Medical Institute and Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital are two of the most recognizable and well-respected equine facilities in the world.
- Horse Capital of the World- Lexington, Kentucky, is considered the "horse capital of the world" by many. The central region is home to about 450 horse farms, and the rolling hills of Kentucky are rich in calcium and limestone, which attribute to helping horses build strong bones.
- Also known for... Kentucky is historically known for its Coal, Tobacco, and Bourbon industries. But it's the latter that has made a full resurgence over the past decade, as the Bourbon industry is pouring \$9 Billion in Kentucky on a yearly basis. Bourbon tours, along with Horse Country Tours have made Kentucky a destination for a great vacation. And of course Kentucky has elite College Basketball Programs, especially at the University of Kentucky which is the home to 8 National Championship Teams only UCLA has more with 11. There's a popular slogan "Kentucky: Fast Horses, Beautiful Women, and Strong Bourbon" in which the adjectives often get switched around.
